Seminars and Conferences

- The Technical Cooperation Section of the Embassy is often called on to participate in important seminars and conferences related to the reform and transformation process. These events are sponsored by Ukrainian and/or international organizations and Canadian Embassy participation is part of our broader support for the transformation process in Ukraine. In May, three such events took place to which the Technical Cooperation Section Staff contributed. The Ukrainian Academy of Foreign Trade was established one year ago. This Academy provides Masters level training in the general area of international trade. Emil Baran, Counsellor, Technical Cooperation, made a presentation on the subject of international cooperation and the role of bilateral and multilateral donors in the transformation process.
- · The University of Kyiv-Mohyla Academy recently announced the establishment of a Master's Degree in Economics. The goal of this Masters program is to help create a new generation of economists trained in modern, market-based economic theory who will assume leadership positions in public and private institutions in Ukraine. This Masters program is sponsored by the World Bank, the Ford Foundation and other foundations. Canada has been involved with Kyiv-Mohyla for several years and has supported several activities.
- The Academy of Public Administration and the World Bank organized a 3-day seminar on Public Administration reform. Many Ukrainian and international speakers were involved, including Deputy Speaker of the Verkhovna Rada, World Bank Resident Representative and Justice Minister. Canada has been active in supporting Ukraine's public sector reform, particularly at the Academy.

Technical Cooperation Staff

· Bruce Steen arrived on May 10, to take up his posting as First Secretary in the Technical Cooperation section of the Canadian Embassy. Bruce, who is originally from Toronto is a graduate of Carleton University in Ottawa, replaces Kati Csaba who has left Ukraine for a posting at the Canadian Embassy in Sarajevo. While this is Bruce's first direct experience with Ukraine, he brings to the position nearly six years of experience with Canada's Program of Cooperation with Central and Eastern Europe, mainly in the area of private sector development in Russia. Bruce's work at the Embassy will include all of the areas and projects which had previously been Kati's responsibility. These include Policy Advice for Reform, the Small Business and Economic Development in Ivano-Frankivsk project, environment projects, and the Canada Fund, among others.
