Canada had the pleasure of hosting the first of two groups of Ukrainian deputy ministers for a successful two-week Executive Program last December.

The executive program is a component of a three-year, \$4.5 million project to support the recently established Institute of Public Administration and Local Government (IPALG) in Kyiv, Ukraine. It is being managed by the Canadian Bureau for International Education (CBIE), and financed by Foreign Affairs and

International Trade Canada. CBIE, CCMD, and U*CAN Canada Ukraine Relations Inc. are delivering the program as part of the federal government's ongoing three-year, \$30 million technical assistance agreement with Ukraine.

The next delegation of 20 is scheduled to arrive in Canada in the fall of 1994. Meanwhile, 40 senior Ukrainian officials will follow a similar program at IPALG in Ukraine, bringing the total number of participants up to eighty.
